In fact, two key officials of the University are Regional Coordinators in the working committees of the Consortium: Dr. Geronimo L. Gregorio (VP for RDE) is Regional Coordinator of the Research Group while Dr. Cora F. Navarra (Dean, Graduate School) is Regional Coordinator of the Applied Communications Group.

Some of their outputs are articles about CapSU activities in relation to WESVARRDEC programs which are published in the regional newspaper Panay News, and also in the WESVARRDEC website and blogspot as well as in the PCARRD website. Likewise, Dr. Navarra (with Mr. Eduardo Navarra) has written a Farm Primer entitled "Ang Pag-obra kag mga Gamit sang Uling nga Ugabhang (Carbonized Rice Hull)" published by the Philippine Council for Agriculture and Forestry Resources Research and Development (PCARRD). She also has edited two other Farm Primers published by the same council.

CAPSU brings opportunities to OSYs

Roxas City (14 May) - About 300 out-of-school youth (OSY) have graduated from the Mobile Technology School (MTS) since its launching in October 2008 to provide Capiceños with skills for gainful employment.

The mobile school project is a brainchild of CapSU and implemented in collaboration with the Capiz provincial government, Technical Education Skills and Development Authority (TESDA) and Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE).

"This is a core program of CapSU Roxas City Main Campus Community Extension Services Office," said CapSU president Dr. Editha Magallanes.

CESO also undertakes consultancy and technical services, information dissemination and skills training development programs.

The various MTS training courses included Basic Arc Welding, Beauty Care and Cosmetology and Beauty Tips which were designed by CapSU to make education accessible to a wider mass of people.

"Frontliners in the implementation of the program in the different towns and barangays in the province are the faculty of the College of Industrial Technology and Engineering," said an MTS briefer.

The MTS briefer also noted that the program will continue to serve the less privileged individuals this 2010 ? 2011 due to its high demand in the province.

Recently, the state university?s aim to help the OSYs has taken another leap as the DOLE is set to turn over livelihood starter kits worth P300,000 to 42 MTS graduates of basic arc welding and beauty care.

"Chosen beneficiaries underwent an orientation and submitted their respective individual business plan and projected income," said DOLE ? Capiz Provincial Head Ricardo P. Monegro. A management team has also been established to monitor and keep track of the project?s status and implementation. (PIA) CapSU Burias holds coconut tree planting

The non-academic personnel of the Capiz State University (CapSU) Burias Campus in Mambusao town planted 137 coconut plantlings across the two-hectare lot of their campus on September 27.

The activity was part of the celebration of the 110th Anniversary of the Philippine Civil Service.

Personnel Officer Emily Launio said the tree planting activity sought to create awareness among their personnel on how they could help address climate change.

Minerva Victoriano, administrative officer at the finance and accounting office, said the activity made her sweat out and exercise thus beneficial to her health.

Rex Berganio, a personnel staff, saw the need for employees like him to be conscious of the effects of climate change.

Benjamin Gutierrez, a university research associate, said he is optimistic about the initiative.

It will make the area ultimately productive because the land planted to coconut has been left idle for some time, he said.

Gutierrez, a trained coconut expert, said the monitoring will be done every three months starting from the planting period. During these periodic visits, the personnel will also help out in the cultivation, including fertilization and other maintenance activities.








Summary of Enrollment (1st Semester 2010-2011)

ENROLLMENT BY CAMPUS, SEMESTER AND GENDER




Summary of Enrollment 2nd Semester 2009-2010

MEDICAL/DENTAL SERVICES

The University's division for health services is cognizant of its responsibility on the students' health and well-being by providing medical and dental assistance and whenever available, free medicine to students. Incoming freshmen and transferees are required to undergo physical examinations in the University clinic. The University physicians prepare the schedules for medical and dental examinations for all students at least once a year.

Lecture on filariasis and distribution of anti-filariasis medicines were taken care of by the University physicians, nurses and clinical instructors in cooperation with the City/Municipal Health units.

Nutrition celebration was emphasized to keep everyone healthy and imparted thorough understanding on the nutritive value of foods eaten, particularly the balanced diet for all.

Medical missions with the NGOs took care of the 28 circumcisions, while dental mission with the Capiz LGU and balikbayan group of dentists extended help to the needy.

LIBRARY SERVICES

The academic year 2009-2010 has been considered a fruitful year to everyone. The library serves as the repository of academic information, source and resource of the school. It is the venue for carrying out quality education and for enriching all parts of the educational process. The University library has collections of books, encyclopedias, journals, newspapers, gazettes and other reading materials for the students.

- 1. Two (2) college librarians finished their Master in Library and Information Service degrees from the Central Philippine University, Iloilo City last March 2010.
- 2. The librarians of the ten (10) campuses attended several trainings and seminars to enhance their field of specialization.
- 3. CapSU Pontevedra Library purchased 496 volumes (230 titles) amounting to one hundred ninety-seven thousand, two hundred twenty-three pesos (Php 197,223.00) The Library has acquired a total of 767 (447 titles) books and compact discs from PLMP and Asia Foundation. It has regular subscriptions of 4 news paper titles (national), magazines and some professional journals.
- 4. The Library of Burias Campus has maintained and preserved its linkages with other institutions of higher learning, government agencies and other agencies both local and international for purposes of sharing resources.

The CapSU Library of Burias Campus is a depository library of the publications of World Bank, FAO (Food and Agriculture Organization) and IDRC (International Development Research Center of Canada). 

Choosing the Best COCO Hybrids using their Physicochemical Attributes as Indices for Economic Utilization (By: Geronimo L. Gregorio)

The study was conducted at Capiz State University (CapSU), Burias Mambusao, Capiz from January 2010 to June 2010 sought to identify and describe the inherent physico-chemical attributes of mature nuts of hybrid coconut collections at the CapSU coconut plantation as indices for economic and industrial utilization. Eleven bearing hybrids were described in terms of their whole nut, husk, shell, meat and liquid endosperm and also according to their copra, cream and VCO yields. Based on the desirable physicochemical attributes, these six hybrids (in descending order) most economically important: CATDxLAGT, MRDxLAGT, MYDxWAT, MRDxBAYT, MRDxTACD and MRDxCATD. Based on the nut characteristics of these hybrids. Below are the most recommended economic and industrial uses of the hybrids.

EXTENSION SERVICES

CapSU is actively involved in the activities of the Western Visayas Agriculture and Resources Research and Development Consortium (WESVARRDEC). In fact, two key officials of the University are Regional Coordinators in the working committees of the Consortium: Dr. Geronimo L. Gregorio (VP for RDE) is Regional Coordinator of the Research Group while Dr. Cora F. Navarra (Dean, Graduate School) is Regional Coordinator of the Applied Communications Group.

Some of their outputs are articles about CapSU activities in relation to WESVARRDEC programs which are published in the regional newspaper Panay News and also in the WESVARRDEC website and blogspot as well as in the PCARRD website. Likewise, Dr. Navarra (with Mr. Eduardo Navarra) has written a Farm Primer entitled "Ang Pag-obra kag mga Gamit sang Uling nga Ugabhang (Carbonized Rice Hull)" published by the Philippine Council for Agriculture and Forestry Resources Research and Development (PCARRD). She also has edited two other Farm Primers published by the same council.

CAPSU brings opportunities to OSYs

Roxas City (14 May) -- About 300 out-of-school youth (OSY) have graduated from the Mobile Technology School (MTS) since its launching in October 2008 to provide Capiceños with skills for gainful employment.

The mobile school project is a brainchild of CapSU and implemented in collaboration with the Capiz provincial government, Technical Education Skills and Development Authority (TESDA) and Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE).

"This is a core program of CapSU Roxas City Main Campus Community Extension Services Office," said CapSU president Dr. Editha Magallanes.

CESO also undertakes consultancy and technical services, information dissemination and skills training development programs.

The various MTS training courses included Basic Arc Welding, Beauty Care and Cosmetology and Beauty Tips which were designed by CapSU to make education accessible to a wider mass of people.

"Frontliners in the implementation of the program in the different towns and barangays in the province are the faculty of the College of Industrial Technology and Engineering," said an MTS briefer. The MTS briefer also noted that the program will continue to serve the less privileged individuals due to its high demand in the province.

CapSU has taken another leap as the DOLE is set to turn over livelihood starter kits worth P300,000 to 42 MTS graduates of basic arc welding and beauty care.

"Chosen beneficiaries underwent an orientation and submitted their respective individual business plan and projected income," said DOLE Capiz Provincial Head Ricardo P. Monegro.

A management team has also been established to monitor and keep track of the project's status and implementation. (PIA)

CapSU Burias holds coconut tree planting

The non-academic personnel of the Capiz State University (CapSU) Burias Campus in Mambusao town planted 137 coconut plantlings across the two-hectare lot of their campus last September 27.

The activity was part of the celebration of the 110th Anniversary of the Philippine Civil Service.

Personnel Officer Emily Launio said the tree planting activity sought to create awareness among their personnel on how they could help address climate change.

Minerva Victoriano, administrative officer at the finance and accounting office, said the activity made her sweat out and exercise thus beneficial to her health.

Rex Berganio, a personnel staff, saw the need for employees like him to be conscious on the effects of climate change.

Benjamin Gutierrez, a university research associate, said he is optimistic about the initiative.

It will make the area ultimately productive because the land planted to coconut has been left idle for some time. Gutierrez, a trained coconut expert, said the monitoring will be done every three months starting from the planting period. During these periodic visits, the personnel will also help out in the cultivation, including fertilization and other maintenance activities.


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


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
2010 Gross Income of IGPs by Campus




2010 Gross Income of IGPs by Commodity



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
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
