he Capiz State University started with the merger of Mambusao Agricultural and Technical College (MATEC) in Burias, Mambusao and the Capiz Agricultural and Fishery School (CAFS) in Bailan, Pontevedra to become the Panay State Polytechnic College (PSPC) by virtue of Batas Pambansa Blg. 91 signed by President Ferdinand E. Marcos on December 24, 1980.

At the time of the merging of the two schools, MATEC (started June 22, 1958 by virtue of RA 2088, which has two existing satellite campuses located in Tapaz and Sapian) and CAFS (started June 21, 1957 by virtue of RA 1785 and 1786) were headed by Dr. Ernesto V.

Botin and Dr. Wenceslao O. Sison Jr., as Superintendents, respectively. The seat of administration of PSPC was in Burias, Mambusao.

On August 29, 1981, Dr. Ernesto V. Botin took his oath of office as the first PSPC President and Dr. Wenceslao O. Sison Jr. became his Vice President. With the appointment of Dr. Sison as College President of Northern Iloilo Polytechnic State College, Dr. Anthony N. Navarrosa was appointed to take over his place as Vice President which was later upgraded to the position of Executive Vice President. The head of the campuses

were called Deans

In 1982, with the approval of the Board of Trustees, the Office of the College President added satellite campuses in the municipalities of Dumarao and Pilar. In 1986, President Corazon C. Aquino reappointed

Dr. Botin as PSPC President. When his term ended on July 24, 1993, Dr. Navarrosa, the Executive Vice President, served as Officerin-Charge of the College until the appointment of Dr. Rochellir D. Dadivas as the second PSPC President on October 12, 1994.

During the time of Dr. Dadivas, he was assisted by Dr. Anthony N. Navarrosa, Executive Vice President; Dr. Editha L. Magallanes, Vice President for Academic Affairs; and Dr. Nicolas A. Braña, Vice President for Research, Development and Extension.

In accordance with the pertinent provisions of Republic Act 7722 (otherwise known as the Higher Education Act of 1994) and

Republic Act 8992, on November 4, 1998, the Capiz Institute of Technology (founded 1917) in Roxas City, including its Department of Fisheries in Dayao (formerly Capiz School of Fisheries founded 1961), became an integral part of the PSPC system. This was approved in the 54th Regular Board Meeting held at the CHED Conference Room, San Miguel Avenue, Ortigas Center, Pasig City. However, the official turnover was done on October 25, 1999 by CHED Region VI-Western Visayas Director Tomas P. Parreño to PSPC President Dadivas. Then, on December 19, 2000,

Sigma College of Science and Technology (started January 1, 1996 by virtue of RA 7973) in Sigma, Capiz was integrated into PSPC.

In 1999, Cong. Manuel "Mar" A. Roxas of the 1st District of Capiz filed a bill seeking for the conversion of PSPC into a state university.

Both the City Council of Roxas City and the Provincial Board of Capiz passed the resolution supporting the bill.

On September 15, 2000, the Board of Trustees approved the new organizational structure of the College with three (3) units, namely: the Roxas City Unit, the Mambusao Unit and the Pontevedra Unit. Each unit was headed by a Chancellor. The Mambusao Unit has six (6) satellite campuses: Burias Campus in Mambusao, Sapian Campus, Tapaz Campus, Sigma Campus, Mambusao Campus, and Dumarao Campus. The Pontevedra Unit has Pontevedra Campus and Pilar Campus; while the Roxas City Unit has Roxas City Campus and Dayao Campus. The first Chancellors were Dr. Nenita A. Beluso for Pontevedra Unit, Supt. Primitivo V. Bangcoyo for Roxas City Unit and Dr. Geronimo L. Gregorio for Mambusao Unit. The campuses were headed by Campus Administrators who report directly to the Chancellors.

In 2001, the seat of administration was transferred to Mambusao Campus for accessibility and ease of communication. The second sets of Chancellors were Dr. Edgar M. Dilla for Pontevedra Unit, Dr. Genoveva N. Labaniego for Mambusao Unit and Dr. Evaristo M. Magoncia for Roxas City Unit. With the retirement of Dr. Navarrosa in 2003, the position of Executive Vice President, being co-terminus, ceased to exist.

In March 2002 the bill for the conversion of PSPC into a state university was approved in the House of Representatives and the

Senate approved the same measure on February 6, 2004. Cong. Rodriguez D. Dadivas of the 1st Congressional District and Cong. Fredenil H. Castro of the 2nd Congressional District were responsible in lobbying for the passage of the conversion law.

Then, a milestone was reached on March 21, 2004, when President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo signed into law Republic Act No. 9273 at Capiz Provincial Capitol, Roxas City converting PSPC into a state university, the Capiz State University. At the time of the conversion,

the incumbent Governor of Capiz was Hon. Vicente B. Bermejo with Hon. Victor A. Tanco as Vice Governor. Following the provision of the University Charter, the seat of administration was transferred to Roxas City.

Dr. Rochellir D. Dadivas, the incumbent PSPC President at the time of conversion became the first University President. The three Vice Presidents were Dr. Editha L. Magallanes, Vice President for



Agronomy Building after its completion.

Administration and Finance; Dr. Aladino L. Leccio, Vice President for Academic Affairs; and Dr. Geronimo L. Gregorio, Vice President for Research and Extension.

On July 7, 2008, after the retirement of Dr. Dadivas as University President, Dr. Editha L. Magallanes was appointed as the second University President of Capiz State University. During the term of Dr. Magallanes, her Vice Presidents were Dr. Aladino L. Leccio for Administration and Finance, Dr. Herminia B. Gomez for Academic Affairs and Dr. Geronimo L. Gregorio for Research, Development and Extension (RDE). Per Board of Regents' Resolution No. 1112, series of 2009, the chancellor positions were abolished in view of overlapping functions with the campus administrators.

Having been rated Outstanding by the Evaluation and Search Committee towards the end of her first term as University President in June 2012, Dr. Editha L. Magallanes was re-appointed as President of Capiz State University on July 7, 2012.

With the retirement of Dr. Gregorio, Dr. Cora F. Navarra replaced him as Vice President for Research, Development and Extension effective November 7, 2012. The untimely death of Dr. Cora F. Navarra, left the VP RDE office vacant. Dr. Pedro G. Gavino was then designated as the Officer-in-Charge on March 5, 2014 and assumed office on June 1 of the same year.

With the retirement of Dr. Herminia B. Gomez in September 17, 2014, Dr. Editha C. Alfon is now designated as the Vice-President for Academic Affairs.

riority thrusts have been identified based on the resources of the University and the financial assistance and support of the government particularly in infrastructure rehabilitation, improvement of quality instruction for ASEAN integration through program accreditation, revision of the University Code, and its curricular offerings.

As to the curricular offerings, two programs passed Level III AACCUP accreditation, ten programs passed Level II and were qualified for Level III, six programs passed Level II, seven programs passed Level I while ten programs passed the preliminary visit during the year 2015.

On its board curricular programs, the 2015 Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) licensure examination performance of the University's first timers - the Bachelor of Secondary Education, Bachelor of Science in Criminology, and the Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering were among which results were above the national passing rate. Overall passing percentage of CAPSU in PRC licensure examination performance is 51.51%.

Of the 3,008 graduates of batch 2015, 176 were awarded academic honors - eleven were awarded Magna Cum Laude, 159 were Cum Laude, three were high school Valedictorians, and another three were Salutatorians.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Science and Technology Academic Research Books Operation Kiosk System (STARBOOKS) project of DOST with CAPSU was officially launched through the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signed by DOST Regional Director Rowen Gelonga and CAPSU President Dr. Editha L. Magallanes on April 2015.

In the area of Research, several faculty members have attended and presented research papers in the International level. Dr. Susan O. Dangan was awarded Best Power Point Presenter during the 2nd International Conference on Multidisciplinary Research. Dr. Editha L. Magallanes, Dr. Amel L. Magallanes, and Dr. Analiza Pamplona served as plenary speakers during the International Conference on Quality Higher Education: Global Perspectives and Best Practices sponsored by SEAMEO RETRAC and British Council at the Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

Several faculty received Regional and Provincial awards on the researches conducted in 2015. There were 35 completed faculty researches, 60 ongoing researches, 19 research articles published in International Refereed Journals and 3 recognized copyright materials. CAPSU also co-hosted the 2nd International Conference on Multidisciplinary Research sponsored by the Philippine Association of Institution for Research, Inc.

The University conducted numerous community and extension services. There were 18 capability-building trainings conducted to equip the researchers with necessary knowledge and skills, 26 potential invention technologies which are undergoing Intellectual Property applications, 81 completed trainings with 3,400 beneficiaries

in arc welding, beauty care, food processing and other livelihood skills enhancement.

Dr. Aladino Leccio, Vice President for Administration and Finance was awarded 2015 Outstanding UPLB Alumni in educational leadership and extension. Dr. Leccio as well, was recognized for his exemplary leadership and valuable contributions to the advancement of higher education by the College of Public Affairs and Development and the CFAP Alumni Association of the UPLB.

In the quest for human advancement in its human resources, 6 graduated the Doctor of Education in different areas of specialization, 2 finished Doctor of Public Administration, and 5 were able to graduate the master's degree. Faculty and staff were likewise sent to attend various seminars, trainings and other activities in the local, regional, national and international levels.

During the Regional Annual Administrative and Tactical Inspection of the Reserve Officer Training Course (ROTC) in Western Visayas CAPSU ranked first with the rating of 95 percent. Dr. Wennie F. Legario is the ROTC Commandant of the University.

As to the implementation of the rehabilitation of infrastructure damaged by Typhoon Yolanda, the University has fully implemented 83 projects amounting PhP76,811,955.43 intended for the nine campuses of the University within December 2015.

CAPSU was able to establish strong partnership with Philippine Nippon Technical College and White Dove Recruitment Agency which was able to send CAPSU graduates to Japan working in different industries. It has

linkages with St Dominic College of Asia which helped faculty and student trainings in food technology, hotel and restaurant management, and food processing.

CAPSU hosted the Regional Culture and the Arts Festival participated by eleven SUCs in Western Visayas on November 4-6, 2015. CAPSU championed in Chorale, Vocal Duet, Short and Sweet Play, Charcoal Rendering, Quiz Bowl, Live Band, and On the Spot Painting.

In the National Culture and the Arts Festival held in Legazpi City on November 29- Dec 3, 2015, CAPSU was first runner-up in Charcoal Rendering, 2nd runner-up in Chorale Singing and Vocal Duet, 4th runner-up in On-the-Spot Painting and 5th runner-up in the Live Band.

CAPSU as well hosted the Regional SCUAA Olympics participated by eleven SUCs in Western Visayas on December 18-23, 2015. CAPSU championed in the Chess (Men), Table Tennis (Women), 2 golds in Pencak Silat (Men) and another 2 golds in Women, and 1 gold in Taekwondo (Women). CAPSU ranked 5th among the 11 SUCs in Region 6.

CAPSU ranked fourth in the Top Ranking SUCs with the Most Number of Assessed Programs by AACCUP in 2015.


The University as well ranked number 6 in the Top Ranking SUCs with the most number of accredited programs (Levels I-IV) by AACCUP in 2015.

The Philippine Society of NSTP Educators and Implementers awarded CAPSU for a job well done in hosting the 13th National Congress of NSTP at Punta Villa, Iloilo City.

FACULTY AND STAFF WERE LIKEWISE SENT TO ATTEND VARIOUS SEMINARS, TRAININGS AND OTHER ACTIVITIES IN THE LOCAL, REGIONAL, NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL LEVELS.



The Office of the Academic Affairs takes active part in the implementation of the University Strategic Plan through the provision of quality education. Educationally qualified, well trained, and vertically articulated faculty members were hired to handle classes to ensure the delivery of exceptional, advanced and relevant instruction to its clienteles. Useful policy guidelines and proposals were implemented. Active involvement of the faculty, staff and students in various in and out of school activities which highly attributed to enhanced learning and development.



### **ENROLMENT**

The total enrolment for the graduate, undergraduate and prebaccalaureate levels during the First Semester 2014-2015 reached 16,972. However, in the Second Semester 2014-2015 there was a slight reduction and enrolment was only 16,020. Below is table 1 showing the enrolment for First and Second Semesters in 2014-2015.

Enrolment in the baccalaureate programs can be viewed in Table 3. The highest number of enrollees were in the Bachelor of Secondary Education with 2,728, followed by Business Administration having 2,029 enrolled students and the Bachelor of Public Administration had the least enrolment of 28.

Of the total 3,008 graduates, there were **176 recipients of academic honours** in the 2015 batch of graduates. Eleven were Magna Cum

Laude, 159 Cum Laude, 3 high school Valedictorians, and another 3 Salutatorians. In the advanced education eight graduated in the Doctor of Education while 5 graduated in the Doctor of Public Administration. Twenty-six graduated in the Master in Management major in Educational Management. There were nineteen graduates in Master of Science while eleven graduated in Master of Arts and another eleven in Master in Public Administration.

In the baccalaureate program, the Bachelor of Secondary Education had the most number of graduates (262), followed by Bachelor of Elementary Education (238), Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and Bachelor of Science in Criminology with 205 and 181 respectively. The least number of graduates can be found in the Bachelor of Science in Animal Science (7) and Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (8). However, in the pre baccalaureate level, the Certificate in Computer Programming had the highest graduates (321) followed by the Certificate in Industrial Technology (305), Hotel and Restaurant Management (90). The least number of graduates is in Two Year Certificate in Electrical Technology (31). In the Laboratory high school a total of 121 graduated. There were 3 high school Valedictorians, 3 Salutatorians while there were those who belong to the top 10 of the graduating batch 2015 qualified to avail of the Iskolar ng Bayan Scholarship program. Shown in Table 5 are the graduates in the different curricular offerings of the University.

## PERFORMANCE IN THE LICENSURE EXAMINATION



Among the curricular offerings which have board licensure examination, the Bachelor of Secondary Education, Bachelor of Science in Criminology, and Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering had results which were above the national passing percentage. In the Registered Master Electrician Examination (RME) administered by PRC, Guillermo B. Sabolbora garnered fifth place. The overall results of the board performance is 51.51 percent. 

## UNIVERSITY CODE REVISION



leven years had passed and so many new laws have been implemented which were not within the scope of the original version of the University Code. The management deemed it wise to revise the University Code to keep abreast with the rapid changing times. chapters. Likewise, all manuals will undergo revision based on the revised University Code. A committee had been formed to take charge of the revision of all manuals.

## CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT




committee was formed on May 2015 in consonance with the letter from the CHED Chair Patricia Licuanan to revise all baccalaureate programs following the Outcome Based Education (OBE) curriculum. The revised curriculum was submitted for BOR approval on the last quarter of 2015. The BOR stamped its approval provided all syllabi must also be OBE tailored including the grading system.

### SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL OFFERING

n preparation for the 2016 implementation of the Senior High School (SHS), the University has submitted its intention to apply for the offering of SHS to CHED Central Office on October 22, 2015. At the same time a BOR approval was sought subject to the acceptance of the Department of Education (DEPED). The University limits the number of SHS students as it has its faculty and staff development program intended for the implementation of the K to 12 program. There were faculty and staff identified to avail of the CHED Scholarship program during the transition period. Teaching loads, research and extension has long been arranged to combat the years of the K to 12 implementation. Classroom and laboratory facilities to be utilized in the K to 12 implementation have been identified.



The Office of the Student Affairs Admission and Guidance accepted and conducted interviews and administered the University admission test for applicants seeking admission to the University on the months of April and May 2014. Student applicants for the different scholarship programs were also interviewed. Students who were interested to become student assistants, interested in cultural and athletics were also given time for interview and audition. Other sponsors of scholarship programs either by government agencies like the DA ACEF and the DOST and many others were also given the time to administer competitive examination for interested students of the University.





### LIBRARY IMPROVEMENT

IN ITS QUEST FOR IMPROVEMENT THE UNIVERSITY SIGNED A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (DOST) ON APRIL 2015. DR. EDITHA L. MAGALLANES AND DIRECTOR ROWEN GELONGA SIGNED THE MOA IN THE PRESENCE OF THE STAFF AND OTHER KEY OFFICIALS.

he project is known as Science and Technology Academic Research Books Operation Kiosk System (STARBOOKS). The nine campuses of CAPSU were installed computers with the STARBOOKS program which benefited the students and other library users even from those outside the university.

Through the library fees of the nine campuses, new editions of books, magazines, journals, computers and other equipment were purchased to enhance the teaching-learning process of the faculty and students.

The University as well has received some donated books from private individuals during the year 2015.







#### MAIN CAMPUS

The oldest among the libraries in Capiz State University is the Main Campus Library organized in 1954 by its first librarian, Ms. Dolores Deocampo. Today, it is situated in the historic Gabaldon Building, built around the 1930s by virtue of the school-building frenzy throughout the country after the Gabaldon Act was passed.

In February 2015, the Main Campus Library celebrated the National Arts Month by organizing an exhibit called "Daisy: the Life and Works of Daisy Hontiveros-Avellana," a Capiznon National Artist for Theatre and wife of acclaimed director Lamberto Avellana. She was the daughter of the late Capiz governor, senator, and Supreme Court Justice Jose M. Hontiveros. The exhibit materials were loaned to the CapSU Main Library by Ang Panublion Museum. Among the special guests of the event were Ms. Cheryl Anne del Rosario,

Ang Panublion Museum Director, and Ms. Melanie Arancillo, Executive Director, United Capizenos Foundation, Inc.—One Capiz.

In April, CapSU Libraries became the recipient of the DOST-Starbooks from the Department of Science and Technology. Starbooks are computer-based, stand-alone databases containing thousands of digitized information materials in the collection of DOST's library.

In June 2015, Mr. Christian George F. Acevedo was appointed College Librarian I of CapSU Main Campus. He finished Master in Library and Information Science at Central Philippine University in 2014 and passed the Librarians Licensure Examination in April 2015.

In August 2015, the heirs of the late Felisa Ortiz, secondary school head teacher of the former Capiz Trade School (now CapSU Main Campus), donated some 2,000 books to the

Main Campus Library through the Gold and Silver Foundation for Life and Family.

In September 2015, CapSU Libraries had undergone accreditation in different levels.

#### PONTEVEDRA CAMPUS

In October 2015, CapSU Pontevedra Campus through its head librarian, Ms. Marianne Escleto, organized the training-workshop "Web 2.0 Integration in the Library." This program was in partnership with US Peace Corps through its volunteer Ms. Elizabeth Spathe. Through her also CAPSU Pontevedra Campus has acquired a Small Project Assistance (SPA) grant on acquisition of books and ICT facilities and capability building for library staff, attended by all the librarians of the ten campuses.

The rehabilitation of the Main Library started last December 1, 2015, procurement of 5 additional computer units Ph₱74,950 sourced from STF. Lib. Fiduciary Fund, purchase of 2 laptops, 1 LCD projector with screen, 2 units of 3-in-1 printers, 3 GLOBE pocket wifi through the SPA Grants from Peace Corps.

#### SIGMA SATELLITE COLLEGE

CAPSU Sigma under the able leadership of their Satellite Director, Dr. Analie G. Campos, was able to have an approved purchase order of 109 titles, 415 volumes by BAC last August 17, 2015 in addition to the existing library collections. Sigma Library also received 2 units of computer, 1 printer and another computer unit from DOST (STARBOOKS).

#### DAYAO SATELLITE COLLEGE

CAPSU Dayao added a total of 1,024 volumes of books amounting to ₱538,238.00. Another 112 volumes of books were donated, subscription of professional journal for education and criminology.

For facilities, the library of Dayao Satellite College has purchased 10 units of wall fans and stand fans, 50 monobloc chairs, installed glass windows amounting to more than a hundred thousand of pesos. Dayao has also shared with STARBOOKS from DOST, Integrated Library System (ILOHA) for library automation, online subscription of Infotrac and ProQuest functional internet connection

and air-conditioning and installation of Facebook page for updates of library activities.

#### **DUMARAO SATELLITE COLLEGE**

For Dumarao, the library has acquired one unit of split-type air-conditioning system amounting to \$\mathbb{P}\$55,000.00 (documents are already processed in preparation for the delivery of unit).

In November, CapSU librarians joined the Philippine Librarians Association (PLAI) National Congress in Laoag City, Philippines. Furthermore, CapSU Main and Dumarao libraries became the recipients of Filipiniana books from the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA).

### MEDICAL AND DENTAL SERVICES

STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY ANNUALLY ENJOY FREE MEDICAL AND DENTAL CHECK UP



he University has three medical doctors, one dentist and five nurses who take charge of the physical and dental health of the faculty, staff and students. The three medical doctors, dentist and nurses schedule the medical and dental check of students in every campus and satellite colleges of the University.

Every month the medical and dental teams visit each campus and colleges to reach out for all students of the University.

Every semester the University also sponsors the bloodletting campaign for blood donations to the Red Cross of the faculty, staff and students of the University. This half-day blood-letting activity aimed at giving assistance to faculty, staff and students who need emergency blood transfusion for their families. Forty-three (43) bags of different blood types were collected from faculty, staff and students of CAPSU Pontevedra by Capiz Red Cross.

Every semester the University conducts training for first aiders among students. Trained first aiders help and support the medical teams during Intramural Meet, Intercampus Meet, Regional SCUAA events.



## GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING SERVICES









THE UNIVERSITY HAS LICENSED GUIDANCE COUNSELORS TAKING CHARGE OF THE EDUCATIONAL, VOCATIONAL AND EMOTIONAL ASPECTS OF THE STUDENTS.

he guidance counselors take charge of the referral cases from the advisers of students in every section. Students are given section advisers who have daily close personal contact with them. There are also trained peer group counselors who assist the guidance counselors. Early detection among problematic students by the peer counselors, advisers, and faculty would result to prompt assistance.

A training in the Counseling Process-An Alternative Counseling Intervention Program was held on June 10-11, 2015 participated by all guidance counselors. A two-day Orientation Program for College with Parents was also held on June 29-July 10, 2015, Career Orientation and Employment Coaching Seminars by campus are usually held every year to guide and orient students on the life that awaits them after graduation; Student Assessment Through Psychological Evaluation was also held on October 2015-January 2016, a Two-Guidance Convocations for College was also held at CAPSU Roxas City Main Campus on specified dates where lectures were delivered/discussed on self-esteem, handling conflicts, violence and bullying, academic concerns and how to study effectively, spiritual life: relationship with God, dealing with the future, drug abuse and prevention, student safety and other topics.



### STUDENT ORGANIZATION







Every year students are given the opportunity to select the officers of the student body organization. Every college is given the freedom to create organizations that would mold students in leadership. The organizations formed in colleges must submit to the campus the organization created for recognition. Rules and regulations must be strictly followed by the officers and members of every organization existing in the campus/college.



### CANTEEN

Each campus/college has canteens that serve healthy, nutritious and affordable food to the students. Canteen personnel abide with rules on the preparation and serving of food to the clients especially the students. Canteen personnel are advised to get a health card every semester in the City Health Office to ensure that the health of the students is given priority. The University also ensures the sources of water used in the canteen are safe. Every semester sample of water is tested for safety and health of students in the University.

### SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILED BY THE STUDENTS

Various scholarships and grants were enjoyed by qualified students during the year 2015. A total of 6,794 students were able to avail scholarships and grants in the year 2015. Scholars were classified into internally and externally funded (private and government) scholars. Internally funded scholars (701) are charged to the University fund. These are students recognized as academic awardees, dependents of CAPSU faculty and staff, members of the CAPSU band or drum and lyre, CAPSU chorale, editor in chief of campus publication, presidents of the Students Supreme Council, and the Future Leaders of the Philippines. Also given free tuition and other fees are the culture and the arts presenters and athletes who were able to play in the regional level. Externally funded scholars and grantees (6,093) are those whose tuition and other fees are paid by the sponsors either a private individual or by the government institutions. Below is Table 8 showing the number of internally and externally funded scholars of the University.






#### Inter Campus Meet



To ensure the quality of work, CapSU researchers publish their research articles in refereed journals to meet the accepted standards of their discipline. These

refereed journals send the research manuscripts being considered to independent experts in the same field where they evaluate the quality of the scholarship, reliability of findings, relevance to the field, and appropriateness for the journal, among others.

In recognition of their expertise, Dr. Editha L. Magallanes, Dr. Amel L. Magallanes and Dr. Analiza M. Pamplona served as plenary speakers during the International Conference on Quality in Higher Education: Global Perspectives and Best Practices sponsored by SEAMEO RETRAC and the British Council Vietnam on July 30-31, 2015 at the Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

To equip the researchers with necessary knowledge and skills, CapSU conducted a total number of 18 capability-building trainings. Among these capabilities lead them to produce copyrighted materials.

This year, experts of Capiz State University produced 26 potential inventions; 15 of which are being assisted by DOST-TAPI for patent application, six technologies will undergo DOST-TAPI evaluation; and five technologies are being evaluated by the CapSU IPMO. To hasten searching for prior arts, the Intellectual Property Support Office (ITSO) of CapSU can now access up-to-date technologies for patent search with Thomson Innovation.

The researchers of Capiz State University were able to complete a good number of faculty researches while there is a great number of on-going researches waiting for its completion. Research outputs were presented in different conferences or symposia. These outputs were presented in international, national, regional and in the local levels.



The Institute implemented relevant extension projects, promoted the transfer of technical and agricultural technologies, entrepreneurship, and conducted various trainings based on the needs of the partakers, served many farmers, fisherfolks, homemakers, persons deprived of liberty (PDL) or inmates, barangay officials, barangay workers, teachers and even jail and military personnel and out-of-school youth. In the first half of 2015, leads to many service learning for different barangays of Sigma, Capiz headed by Prof. Susan Panes and Prof. Emelda Bacalangco and some BSIE III CIIP students. Some 99 individuals comprising of farmers, housewives, barangay officials and out of school youth attended the seminar provided. Many technologies were shared including the importance of asexual propagation and demonstration on the procedures in inarching, budding top layering, marcotting and grafting.

The CAPSU personnel identified to handle these trainings were Dr. Raul Ticar, Dr. Marjorie Licatan, Dr. Analiza Dionisio, Dr. Sobie Graciadas, Mrs. Evangeline Villareal and Mr. Wilfredo Ledesma. These personnel were already engaged in a number of activities related to the trainings and operation.

And to maximize the University's own resources while seeking to benefit the communities, CAPSU has also embarked on new partnerships with private institutions which equally sought its assistance to realize its social responsibility.

With the continuing effort to support and aide Yolanda victims, CAPSU Roxas City Main Campus thru Engr. Gemma Angelias, Department of Labor and Employment, and Habitat Foundation collaborated and adapted different barangays of Roxas City as beneficiaries to diverse trainings in line. Some 69 interested individuals coming from

barangays of Baybay, Mongpong, Culajao, Banica, Dinginan, and Tiza affected by typhoon Yolanda attended and gained knowledge and new skills concerning carpentry, building wiring installation, and fire causes and prevention. CAPSU Extension implementer in the person of Arch. Jayvee Avelino and Dr. Kenneth Occeño shared their skills on the technologies aforementioned. Participants benefited much owing to their interest and enthusiasm to learn and improve quality of life. Among other practices, the trainers stressed that in carpentry and handling wiring, beneficiaries should observe and practice safety measures in each of the process.

The training drew favorable responses. Trainees were so much eager to learn and all of them are candidates for graduation. The partnership of Capiz LGUs, Department of Labor (DOLE), and Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) through the CAPSU Main Campus Extension's Mobile Technology School and Serbisyo sa Komunidad Aton Ihatag (SKAI) from May to September 2015 paved way for enhancing and upliftment, and promotion of entrepreneurship in communities served. A total of 72 welding kits, 60 fishing boats, 15 carpentry kits and 11 electrical tools were given to the beneficiaries from different barangays of Roxas City and Panay.

To highlight the year for extension, the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMPRO) Region VI has recognized CAPSU's extension program with a Special Award during the 24th Regional Anniversary Celebration held in Bacolod City on the 24th of July, 2015.

Capacities and competitiveness of CAPSU Extensionists are strengthened by means of extension support, education and training services such as attending various activities spearheaded by PASUC VI – EMC in ISAT-U, La Paz, Iloilo City, Paon Beach Resort, Estancia, Iloilo, and Nature's Village Hotel, Talisay City, Negros Occidental on different dates of 2015.

This period has shown huge growth in extension delivery as well as its broadening role in the sector's development. The client system being served by the university continuously expands from farmers, fisherfolks, and extensionists to marginalized sectors such as persons deprived with liberty (PDL), persons with disabilities (PWD), women and out-of-school youth (OSY), and among others. Further, extension initiatives have also undertaken for key players along the value chain.





# REVIEW OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS

THE HIGHLIGHT OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR FY 2015 WAS THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE REHABILITATION AND RECOVERY PROGRAM ON TYPHOON YOLANDA DAMAGED BUILDINGS OF THE UNIVERSITY. A TOTAL OF 83 PROJECTS WERE SUBJECTED FOR REPAIR/RECONSTRUCTION WITH A TOTAL PROJECT CONTRACT AMOUNT OF \$76,280,160.99.

he University Budget for 2015 per Republic Act (RA) No. 10651 or the FY 2015 General Appropriations Act (GAA) is \$\rightarrow{2}375,600,000.00; budget utilization is 96% with disbursement rate of 95%. Off-budget appropriation (as of the September 30, 2015) is \$\rightarrow{2}167,343,682.82 with utilization of \$\rightarrow{2}79,162,008.38 and a disbursement of \$\rightarrow{2}77,487,345.52. The IGP generated income is \$\rightarrow{2}5.479.158.76.

The University observed and implemented cost-cutting measures particularly on MOOE which resulted to the generation of savings in the total amount of Fifteen Million Eight Hundred Five Thousand Pesos (₱15,805,000.00).

In the area of personnel welfare via salary increase, NBC 461 6th Cycle evaluation is in effect for the year in review. A total of 165 faculty positions were reclassified and 56 positions were filled up (chain promotion and natural vacancy). On the other hand, 10 non-teaching personnel were appointed (seven (7) newly hired, two (2) promotions and a re-appointment) to permanent positions. Accordingly, appointments were issued and updating of Personal Services Itemization and Plantilla of Personnel (PSI-POP) was done to reflect the changes due to hiring, promotion and retirement.

Personnel services are properly recognized through the grant of Loyalty Pay, the

issuance of notices of step increment (NOSI) and other benefits and incentives.

University's compliance with the Seal of Good Governance parameters is manifested through receipt of Performance-Based Bonus (PBB) for 2014 from DBM and the grant of the same to qualified personnel.

Office and personnel performances were evaluated in adherence to Performance Review and Evaluation System as stipulated in the Strategic Performance Management System (SPMS) Guide duly approved by the Civil Service Commission. Performance of the campuses/satellite colleges are to be evaluated and ranked based on the Office Performance Commitment and Review (OPCR) and the supporting documents submitted to the office. The individual

personnel performance will be evaluated based on the Individual Performance Commitment and Review (IPCR). Measure of performance as to effectiveness/quality, efficiency and timeliness in the accomplishment/achievement of targets set are based on the strategic functions, core functions and support functions.

The institutionalization of monitoring and coaching activity for the campuses/satellite colleges proved to be beneficial as management/implementation of the existing programs, projects and activities were further improved. Monitoring and Coaching activity was conducted by the Performance Management Team (PMT) of the university. The campus' performance was evaluated in terms of quality and relevance of instruction, research capability and outputs, relationship

with and services to the community and management of resources.

In terms of human resource development, requests to pursue advanced education degrees were granted to deserving personnel. In the first quarter of 2015, six (6) members of the faculty and staff graduated from their respective degree programs: 3 from Burias campus (earned degree in Doctor of Education, Doctor in Public Administration and Master in Business Administration), two (2) from CapSU Pilar, and one (1) Central Administration personnel who graduated with the degree Doctor of Public Administration.

The attendance of personnel to seminars, trainings, workshop, conferences and fora conducted/spearheaded by government agencies such as CHED, COA, DBM, DENR, DA, TESDA, PASUC and some training institutions/organizations were authorized. The attendance and participation to such activities were aimed to further develop their skills, embrace technology development related to their field of specialization and improve services delivery to clientele.

Other than the attendance of personnel to seminars, trainings and other related activities conducted by other government entity, the Central Administration endeavored in the conduct of the following:

- Financial Delivery Unit (FDU) of the University meeting with the DBM RO 6 Director and budget specialists. The meeting was conducted in July 2015 and deliberated issues and concerns on budget utilization;

 Financial planning with focus on the utilization of the unused funds of the campuses. The participants (Campus Administrators, Accountants, Budget Officers and other financial officers) had the review on cash program preparation.

To answer the growing needs of both the students and personnel, various infrastructures and other physical facilities development/enhancement/fabrication are implemented in the campuses/satellite colleges. The building repairs, refurnishing and upgrading are designed to provide conducive, safe and secured working and learning environment. The continuous upgrading of facilities in support to delivery of quality instruction to the studentry is undertaken. Laboratory equipment, IT equipment, communication equipment, automotive laboratory tools, laboratory equipment were procured for the purpose.

Other than the on-going repair and rehabilitation of buildings and structures damaged by typhoon Yolanda, CapSU Burias is implementing the construction of Clonal Nursery Project; the repair of the Essential Oil Laboratory Building; the repair of the Coconut Production Laboratory Building; the installation of water system for the Essential Oil Laboratory Building and for the Organic Native Pig Production; the construction of fence for the Organic Native Chicken Production, and construction of building for the Organic Native Pig Production.

The perimeter fence at CAPSU Pilar that was affected by the road widening project of the

DPWH at Pilar was restored through the request of its satellite college administrator.

A Ceremonial Turn-over of the STARBOOK project of the DOST and MOA signing was held in April 30, 2015 at CapSU Central Office. Present were the DOST Regional Director, Engr. Rowen R. Gelongga and Capiz Provincial Director, Jerbie Dellava, CapSU University President, Dr. Editha L. Magallanes, DepEd Capiz Superintendent, Dr. Mac Aposin and other key officials of the university. Project components (hardware, software and trainings) were released to recipient campuses/colleges of the University and the different national high schools of the Department of Education – Capiz Division.

The Automated Weather Station, a DOSTassisted project at CAPSU Pilar was secured through the installation of a perimeter fence.

Our University has also embraced technology development through the efforts of the MIS office. The Automated Enrolment System is now operational; the On-line Grade Inquiry can now be accessed through the internet.

The public-private partnership was strengthened through the established linkages with the national and international organizations/agencies relative to OJT Scholarship Program, Research Extension Linkages, Student Exchange Program, Faculty Exchange Program with American Chamber of Commerce, St. Dominic College of Asia, Gawad Kalinga Linkages, Philippines Nippon Technical College, White Dove Recruitment Program, Asia Development Bank and International Higher Education Association.

The goal of being an ISO certified University is a motivation that quality management system is in place. Hence, activities such as benchmarking (on August 2015 at Guimaras State College) and workshops on forms harmonization and the synchronization of manual of operation were initiated.

These mentioned major accomplishments and a lot more activities that have contributed to the attainment of our goal towards effective and efficient administration.



Two years after the devastation of Super Typhoon "Yolanda" the Income Generating Projects (IGP) of Capiz State University was not very productive. Agricultural productions are expected to recover five years later under normal conditions. However, with the current conditions of climate change, it will deter the fast recovery of agricultural products.

The income generating projects of the university are expected to augment the meager budget for operation. However, with its present condition, it could not be relied upon to provide an augmentation to the operation of the university. Specifically, the university is investing some resources to income generating projects to different campuses.



#### UNIVERSITY PRINTING HOUSE

The university printing house is one of the income generating projects that operate to cater the printing needs of the campuses. The service provided by the printing house is exclusive for the university printing jobs. Thus, the charging is very minimal provided to the clientele (campuses) just to cover the cost of materials and labor for reproduction.

The operation is being managed by the university central administration and with one permanent personnel and assisted by three (3) job contract personnel. In later part of the year, the university acquired a brand new digital printing machine in order to facilitate the required printing works of the university.



#### **ROXAS CITY (MAIN) CAMPUS**

The Roxas City (Main) Campus is an industrial technology school in its mandate and priority programs. It is based in the heart of the city and very limited area whereby the land area are occupied by school buildings.

However, with its desire to earn additional income through IGP thus, the campus maximize the area by establishing some business stalls for rental purposes. Currently, there are several tenants occupying the business stalls with different nature of business provided. It does not only provide an additional income to the campus but also a great help for the students and university personnel.



#### **BURIAS CAMPUS**

In CapSU-Burias Campus having a large vast of land (150.9823) for agricultural production, they invested in Coconut production as an income generating project and at the same time a research plantation.

The project started as a collaborative project and known as Coconut Breeding Trials Unit (CBTU) of PSPC and PCA.

Another investment project in the campus is the rice production. It comprises of 10 hectares and dependent to rainfall, thus production is unpredictable. Some areas are also used for research and for instructional purposes.

The campus is preparing for investments in poultry and other livestock production as IGP and at the same time an instructional project for the College of Agriculture.



#### **PONTEVEDRA CAMPUS**

The Pontevedra Campus is another operating unit of the university with a wide area of land for both fishery and agricultural production. The campus has a total land area 147.5936 hectares.

The development of production unit of Pontevedra Campus is on-going with 60 hectares of Fishpond; 5.28 hectares of rice fields, 11.85 for sugarcane and other productive areas are used for instructional purposes and as well as for researches.



#### **DAYAO CAMPUS**

The Dayao Campus was established as the Fishery Department during the creation of Capiz Institute of Technology (CIT) and remain as fishery department when it was integrated to Capiz State University.

It has a land area of 11.9818 hectares with seven (7) hectares comprises as fishpond with only around four (4) hectares were occupied by buildings and other facilities. Currently, the portion of the area is being used for trial in organic bangus production.



#### SIGMA CAMPUS

The Sigma Campus was established as Science and Technology College before its integration to Capiz State University. Now it has expanded its program offering to Hotel and Restaurant and Tourism Management.

The campus has established an entrepreneurial stall for business occupancy. It was rented by the clientele from the community for business purposes and this serve as an IGP of the campus.


